God Save the King! Celebrate the King's Birth-day at Colonial Michilimackinac

MACKINAW CITY, MICH. — Join the interpretive staff at Colonial Michilimackinac June 4 to celebrate King George III's 235th birthday with artillery fire, drinks and treats, and other special programs.

“Even if someone has visited in the past, there is always something new to do or see,” said Craig Wilson, Mackinac State Historic Parks’ Chief Curator. “This event provides a deeper understanding of our past and encourages the desire to explore some of the lesser-known corners of history.”

Programs will take place throughout the day. At noon, a special artillery salute will take place on the shore of Lake Michigan, with firings of the mortar, wall gun, and cannon in celebration. At 2:00 p.m., patriotic toasts and refreshments will be available at the Commanding Officer’s House.
