Ice Cream Social and Movie in the Fort August 26

MACKINAC ISLAND, MICH. — Does it get much better than ice cream, games, and a movie? What about if it was all on the Parade Ground of Fort Mackinac on Mackinac Island? And what if it was all free?

That's exactly what is happening at Fort Mackinac on Saturday, August 26, beginning at 8:00 p.m. Sponsored by Mackinac Associates and Doud's Market, guests are welcome to enter Fort Mackinac at the Avenue of Flags (rear entrance) to join in for an ice cream social, games on the parade ground (with costumed interpreters from the fort!), and, as the sun sets, a showing of *Willy Wonka and the Chocolate Factory* under the stars.
