Biddle House and Benjamin Blacksmith Shop are located at 7406 Market Street, The Richard & Jane Manoogian Mackinac Art Museum is located at 7070 Main Street. American Fur Co. Store & Dr. Beaumont Museum and McGulpin House are on the corner of Fort and Market Streets. All are on Mackinac Island.



MACKINAC'S PAST TUCKED INTO THE PRESENT

Nestled throughout the hustle and bustle of downtown Mackinac Island, Historic Downtown Mackinac takes you on a journey from the late 18th century to today, with historic architecture, incredible stories, exquisite art, and world-class exhibits. The Biddle House, featuring the Mackinac Island Native American Museum, allows you to step into the 1830s home of Agatha and Edward Biddle and experience a time of change for the Anishnaabek of northern Michigan. The Richard & Jane Manoogian Mackinac Art Museum, in front of Fort Mackinac in Marquette Park, features a rare and exceptional collection of Mackinac-related art and photography. The Benjamin Blacksmith Shop transports you to the 1950s where a working blacksmith creates in front of you. The American Fur Co. Store & Dr. Beaumont Museum is home to Mackinac's Medical Miracle, where an accidental gunshot altered medical history. Finally, the McGulpin House is one of the island's oldest structures, dating to 1790.
